slowly

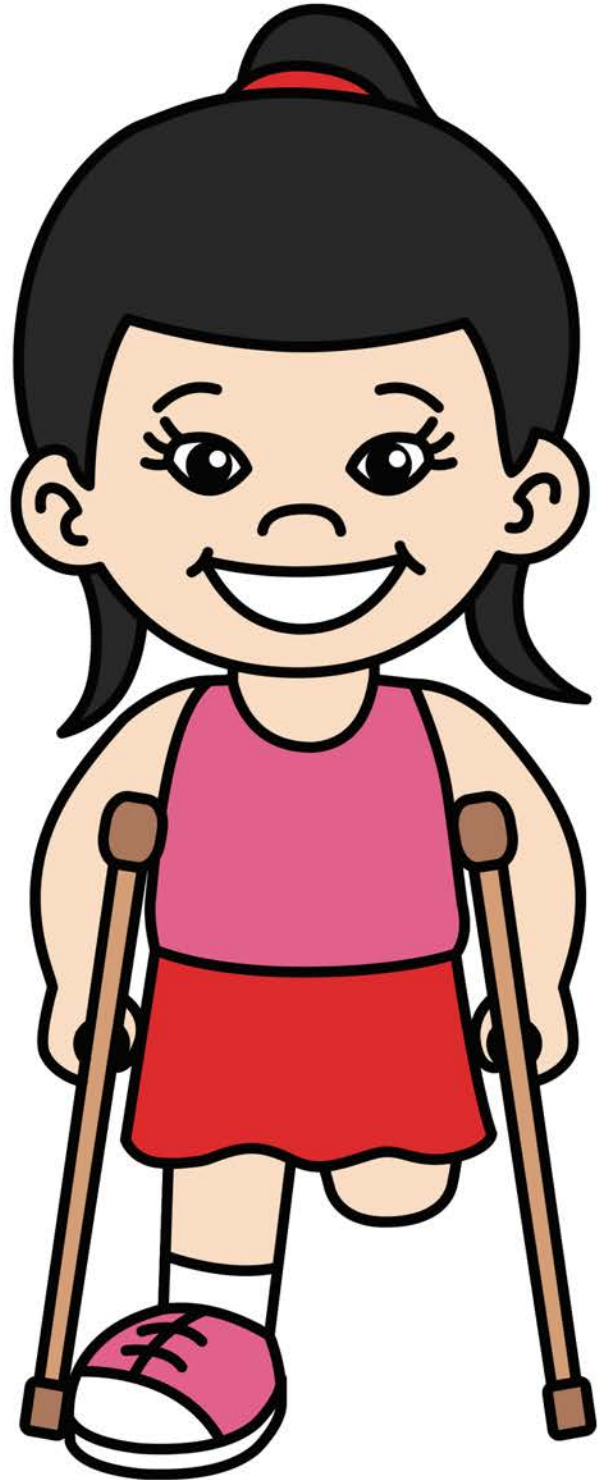

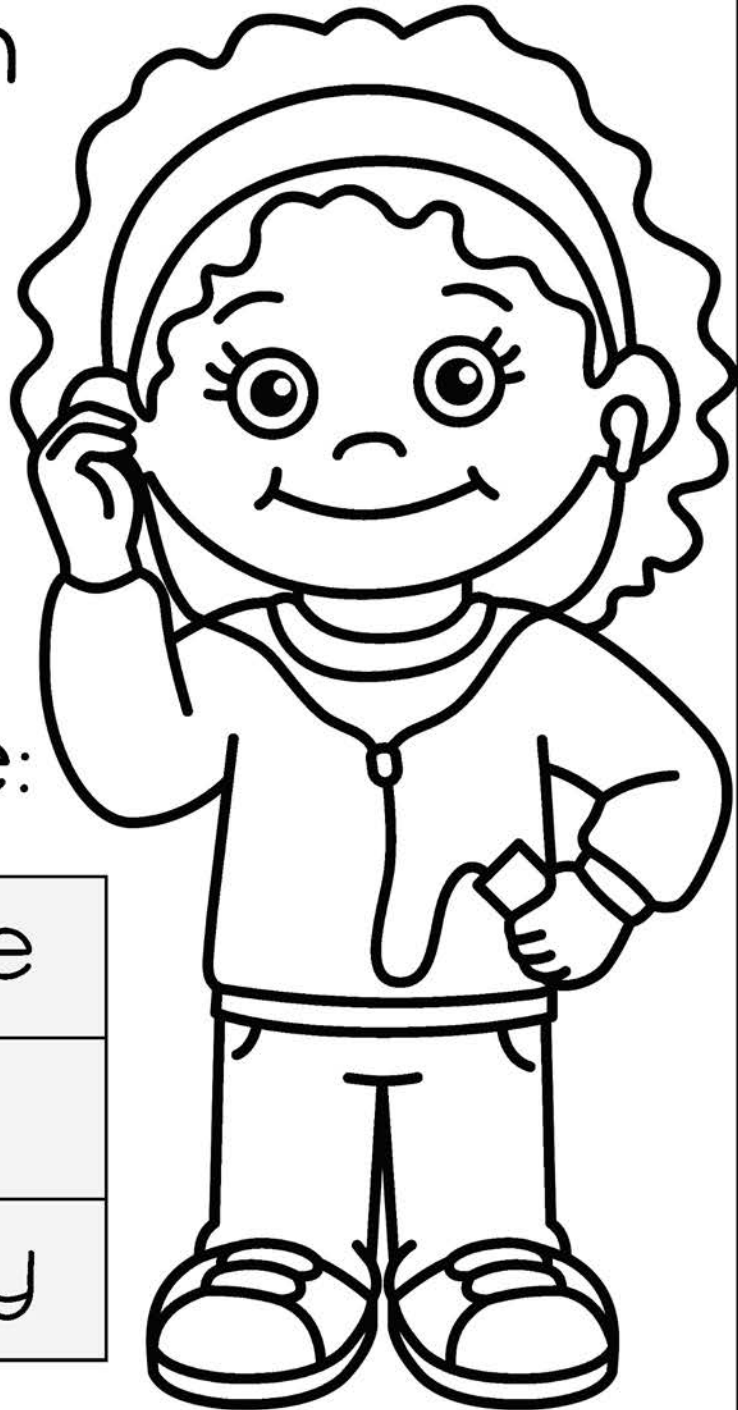

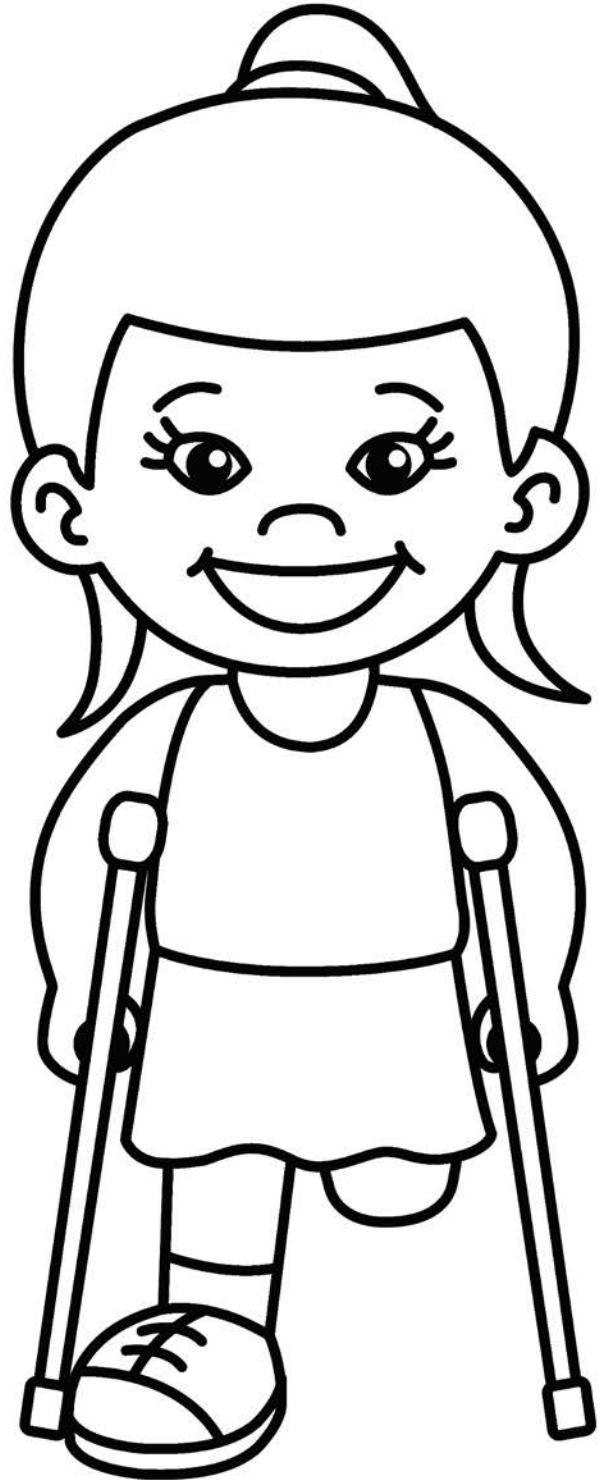
