Tigers are known as the most dangerous and fearsome animal in the jungle. Tigers are land mammals that hunt their prey alone. Tigers don't usually attack people first. However, they will sometimes attack humans when they feel threatened by them.

Tigers usually live more than 20 years, and female tigers live longer than males. Only female tigers take care of their cubs, and male tigers are bigger than females. Adult male tigers usually weigh about 420 pounds, and females weigh 100 pounds less than the males.

Tigers have longer canine teeth, and one of those teeth is at least 10 times longer than the longest tooth in our mouths. Tigers use their big canine teeth and powerful jaws to kill their prey with only one bite.

Tigers cannot run fast for long, so they try to get close to their prey before they attack. They can creep quietly with their huge padded paws. Then they spring to attack their prey and grab it with their claws. They usually drag their prey into the bush and sometimes bury some leftovers for their next meal.

Weather Instruments

In order to measure the weather, weather instruments such as a thermometer, a barometer, a rain gauge, a wind vane and a weather map are needed. A thermometer measures the air temperature. A volcano is a mountain with a large hole at the top. When it is active, lava, which is extremely hot liquid rock, is forced to come out of the hole. An active volcano can be very dangerous because it can destroy an entire town or city and cause tsunamis, flash floods, earthquakes, mudslides and rockfalls.

What makes a volcano erupt? The Earth's crust is made up of plates that fit together like a puzzle. However, these plates sometimes move, and the friction that is caused by their movement causes earthquakes and volcanic eruptions.

There is a fun and easy way to experiment with volcanic eruptions using baking soda. Fill a cylinder or bottle with warm water and a bit of red food coloring. Add 6 drops of detergent and 2 tablespoons of baking soda to the container. Then slowly pour vinegar into it.

The baking soda and vinegar cause a chemical reaction. Pressure builds from the carbon dioxide gas inside, so the gas bubbles out of the cylinder.
