(31 - 33)

T: OK, class. Yesterday we talked about natural disasters such as earthquakes, tornadoes, floods, and volcanic eruptions. Today we are going to do a fun

experiment by making a tornado in a bottle. I am going to explain how we can make our own mini tornado, so please pay attention. First, we need water, a clear plastic bottle with a cap, glitter, and dishwashing liquid. Next, fill the plastic bottle threequarters full with water. Then add a few drops of dishwashing liquid. After that, sprinkle in a few pinches of glitter, and close the bottle with the cap. Close the cap tightly and make sure that it doesn't leak. Lastly, turn the bottle upside down and quickly spin the bottle in a circular motion. You will see a mini tornado forming in the water. In this experiment, when you spin the bottle in a circular motion, it creates a water vortex. A vortex is a mass of wind or water that spins quickly and pulls things into its center. Vortexes can be found in tornadoes and hurricanes. Now, I want the leader of each group to come up and get the materials you need for this experiment.

(34 - 36)

T: Today we are going to practice shooting a basket-ball. Some of you might already know how to play basketball, but for those who have never played basketball, you don't have to worry about not having any experience. Even experienced players sometimes have a hard time shooting the ball into the hoop. I am going to show you the easiest way to make a perfect shot, so please watch and listen carefully.

Look at where I am standing now. I am standing about four to five feet from the basketball hoop. Dribble the ball a few times to feel the bounce of the ball. Now, shoot the ball toward the hoop by bringing the ball to your chest level and extending your arms straight out. Next, try shooting from waist level. When you are used to shooting the ball from the two positions, try shooting the ball while jumping slightly.

Please line up now. When it is your turn, I want you to stand four to five feet from the basketball hoop. I will throw the ball to you. Dribble the ball a few times, and shoot from chest level the first time and from waist level the second time. Let's begin!

(37 - 39)

- T: In the last 100 years, there have been a lot of changes, especially in the things we use daily.I am going to show you a picture of something used in the past. Can anyone tell me what this is?

Thanks to the Gold Rush, the population of San Francisco rapidly increased from almost nothing to over 300,000 people between the years of 1848 and 1860. San Francisco was not ready to have so many people all of a sudden at that time. The town needed more places to live, food to eat, clothes to wear, stores to sell things, and even factories to produce goods for the newcomers. However, it wasn't a big problem as the town was full of people with different backgrounds. Although not everyone was successful at finding gold, many people were able to find new work opportunities. As more people started living and working in San Francisco, the town soon became an important center for trade and banking.

(34 - 36)

T: OK, class. Today, we are going to talk about shapes of the Moon. Last month, I asked you to observe the Moon and draw a picture of the Moon every night. When you were observing the Moon, what shape was it? Did the Moon have the same shape throughout the whole month, or did it change? Sometimes the Moon looks like the letter D or C, and sometimes, it looks flipped. The reason the Moon changes its shape is because of the Sun. The Moon does not make its own light, so it gets its light from the Sun. We call this reflection. Also, the Moon revolves around the Earth. Because it keeps moving, we see different parts of the Moon every day. At the start of every cycle, the Moon is between the Earth and the Sun. So we cannot see the Moon, and we call it a new Moon. When the Moon is behind the Earth, we see a full Moon. The period in which the Moon goes around the Earth is called the lunar cycle. Lunar means moon. The phases happen in the same order every time, and it usually takes 29 and a half days to complete 1 cycle. Do you have any questions?

(37 - 39)

- **T:** OK, I am going to show you some pictures, and you tell me anything that comes to mind.
- S1: I think I know the place, but I can't think of its name. I saw it on a TV show on the travel channel. Is that place in Peru?
- **T:** Yes, this is the city of Machu Picchu. It is in the Andes in Peru.
- **S2:** Mrs. Livingstone, I've heard people say Machu Picchu is great, but what makes the city so special?
- T: Good question, Tom. I was just going to talk about that. The city of Machu Picchu was built more than 500 years ago by a group of people called the Incas. They built this huge place with only the simplest hand tools. With their limited tools, they put up huge stone buildings for homes, food storage, and even temples. The Incas not only built buildings, but also studied the sky and the stars a long time ago. Look at this picture. This is called Intihuatana. What do you think the purpose of this huge stone is?
- S1: Is it a huge tomb for the leader of the city?
- S2: Maybe it is a big playground for children.
- T: Those are interesting answers, but the Incas actually used this stone to tell the dates of the two equinoxes. An equinox is a date when night and day are of equal length, and it only happens twice a year. Scientists today calculate the equinoxes by using telescopes and other tools. However, the Incas were smart enough to use this stone to tell when day and night were of equal length.
- **S1:** How did the Incas find the dates of the equinoxes using that stone?
- T: Very good question. When there's an equinox, the Sun covers the stone, so the stone casts no shadow. On the day of the equinox, the Incas celebrated because they believed that their celebrations would connect the Sun to the Earth. They believed that offering sacrifices during this time would bring them good luck. Although it is a superstition, I am very amazed by their intellect and imagination.
