front paws.**

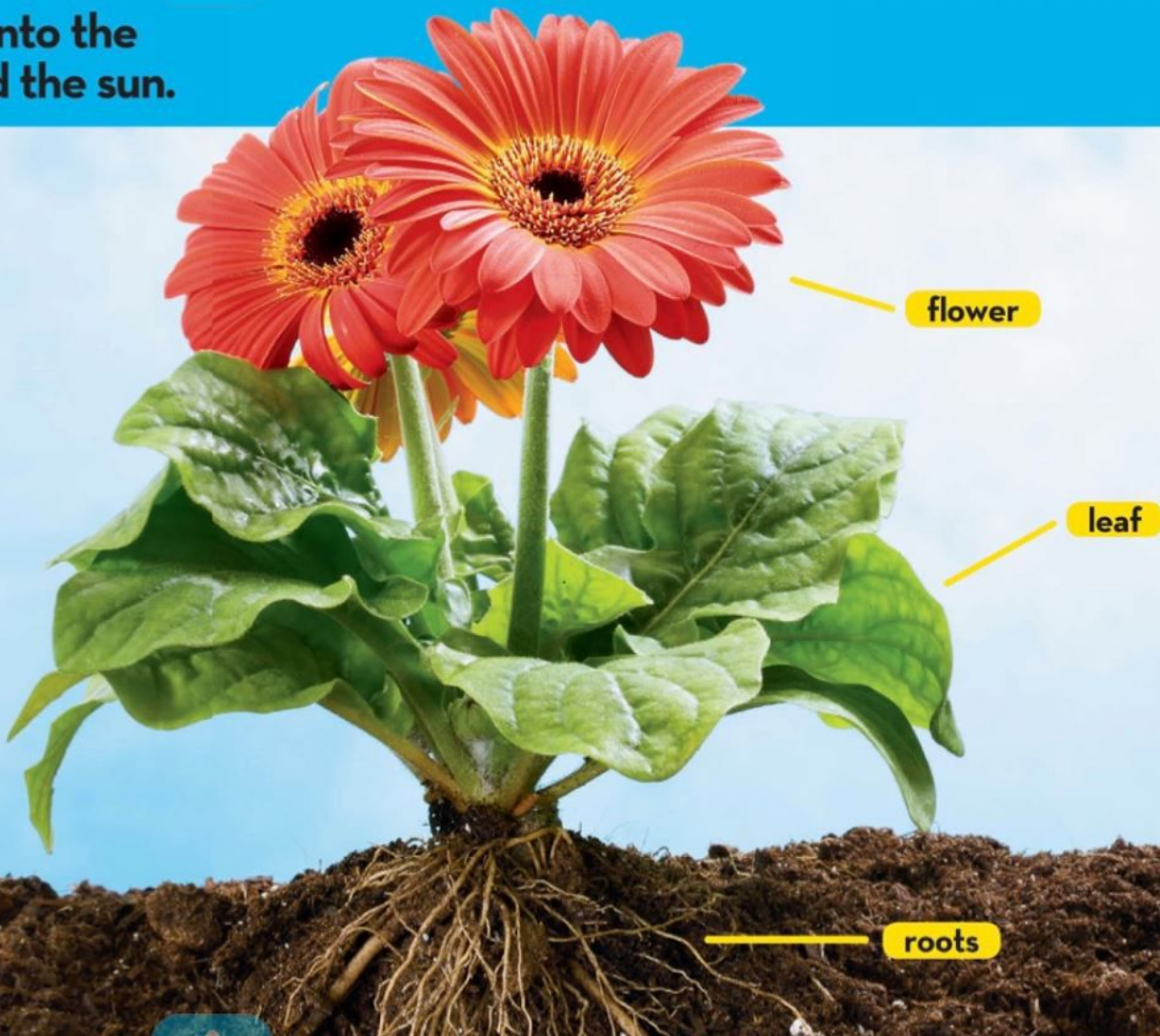
A mommy and daddy dig in the garden to plant flowers.

A mother polar bear uses her paws to dig a den in the snow. It is wintertime.

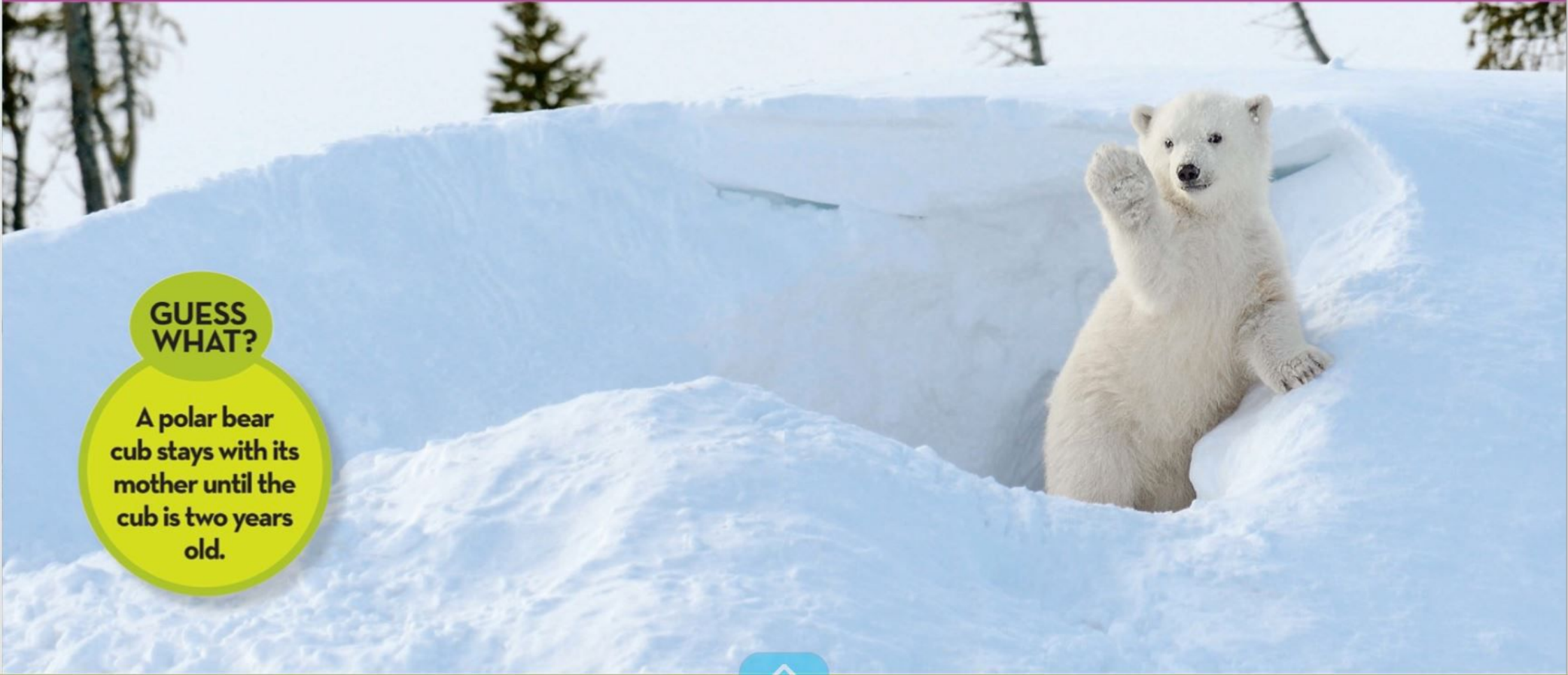


A baby polar bear is born inside the cozy snow den.
