The bird with the red feathers had a good idea. "Hummingbird can use my feathers for a necklace," he said. He plucked off eight feathers and tied








Spider said, "I can spin silk for a delicate veil." Then she helped the tailor with the gown.


"Hummingbird, I hope you now see how special you are," he said. "Only you can make music with your wings."
