Dogs are good pets! Would you like to teach a dog? It's hard work, but it's fun.

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## Give a dog a treat when he behaves.

Then say, "Good dog!"

This dog wants the treat.




First, teach the dog the word sit.

If she sits, give her a treat.

Next, put out your hand and say, "Stay!"

If she stays, give her a treat.

Now say, "Come!" If she is clever, she will come!

This dog learns to stay.

This dog sits up to beg.

This dog is shy or scared.

A dog can't talk. So he gives a signal. If his tail is down, he's sad.

This dog wants to play.

If he's wagging his tail, he's happy.

If he's digging, maybe he found a bone!
