Grandpa gave each child a flashlight, and they pretended they were explorers.






Sonia and Dina went down one dark hall, and Miguel went down another. The house looked strange in the low light.

The lights in the house came back on.


"I think that's a sign that it's time for lunch," said Grandpa.


