"My pet plays the drums," says Glen.


"My pet sings," says May.

Glen's pet plays the drums. It is too loud! Pull the plug!






Min's pet made a cake. It looks so good. We want some!

The class claps and claps!


Now the show is over. Which pet wins? They all do!


