Today, our nation has laws to protect workers. Some laws protect children too.


Now children go to school instead of going to work.

Labor Day is also a day for having fun. So, let's celebrate!


Many cities have Labor Day parades. Have you ever gone to one?

Labor Day is a good day for the beach.










