



Aren't they fun to watch?






Meerkats have spotted fur and ink black noses. Is that a mask around their bright eyes?

No. It's dark fur!


See the meerkats sit up tall!




A meerkat mob will use up to five burrows at a time.

Chapter 2

Where Do Meerkats Live?

Meerkats dig burrows with their long claws. A burrow is a home under the ground. Meerkats move from one burrow to the next. There are many ways to get in and out of the burrow. A burrow has many rooms that are joined by tunnels. It may be hot outside, but the rooms stay cool.




Meerkats rest in the burrows. This is where they have their babies too. Baby meerkats are called pups. Aren't they cute?


