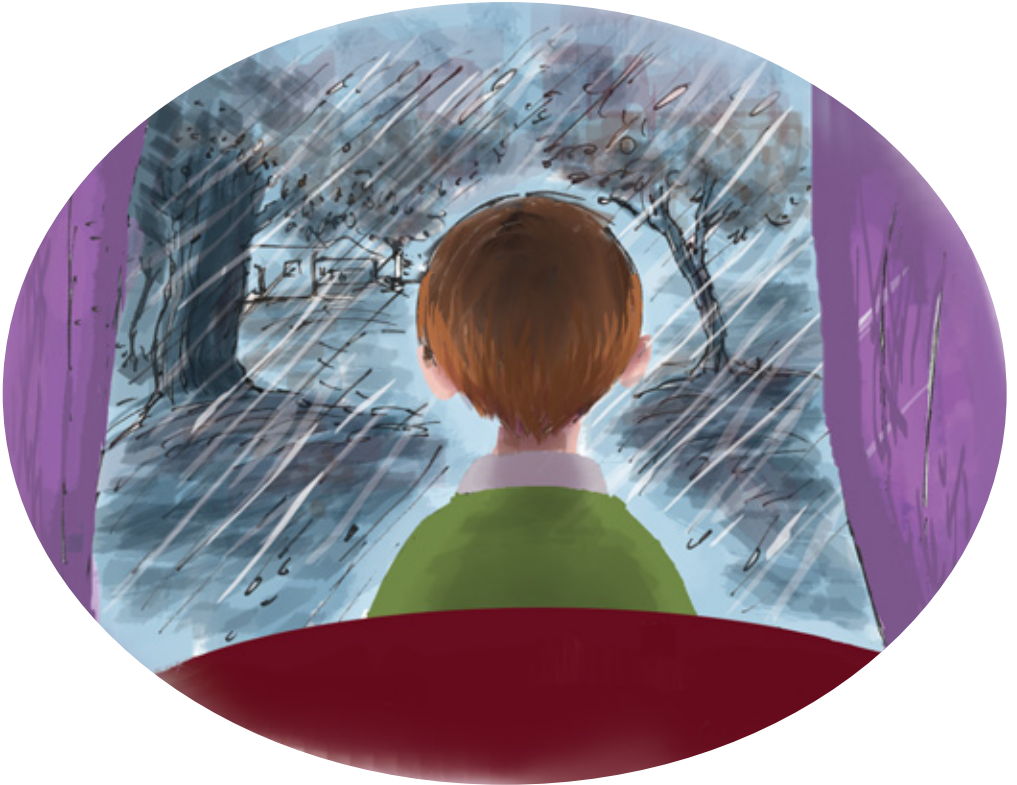
Gloomy Day
