

Sonja looked puzzled. "I don't know," she said slowly. "I've never seen it before. Maybe a neighbor left it for us."


"I wonder what is inside!" Ben said.



to help a local food kitchen. Early in November, teachers, kids, and parents arrived at Tuxedo Park Elementary School. They came to bake Thanksgiving pies. They would give the pies to the Suffern Soup Kitchen.

The Suffern Soup Kitchen is in Suffern, New York. It provides food to people who don't have enough to eat.

That morning, everyone unpacked bags of groceries and supplies. They brought sour apples, butter, and apple peelers.



Helping others can be a lot of fun.

The kids were excited to help needy people. The pies would be served with turkey, mashed potatoes, and other delicious side dishes.

First, the kids and parents peeled apples. Then they cut the apples into slices. They put sugar and cinnamon on the apples and poured this filling into crusts. The teachers put the pies in the oven. Soon the school smelled great!

The kids decorated pie boxes while the pies baked. Once the pies cooled, they put the pies in the boxes. They made 57 pies in all. The teachers then delivered the pies to the Suffern Soup Kitchen. The soup kitchen was thankful to have the pies to serve. The people eating at the soup kitchen enjoyed the apple pies.



Helping with Hunger

The Suffern Soup Kitchen has helped feed the community for over 20 years. It serves dozens of people each day. It is open seven days a week, 365 days a year.
