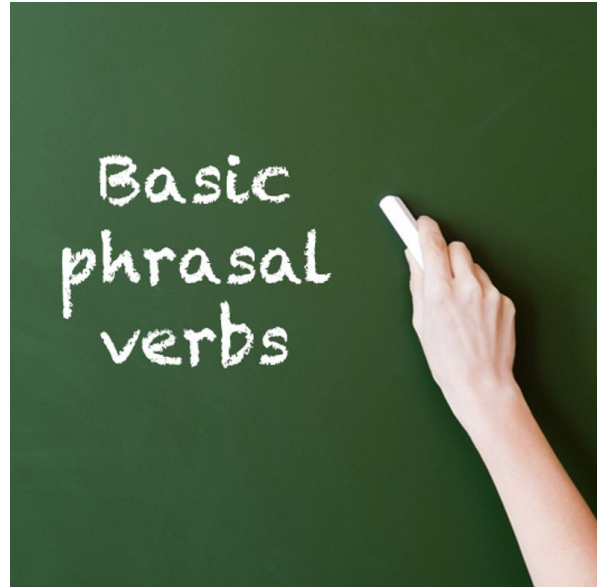

4 Phrasal verbs - grammar

The phrasal verbs in Exercise 3 take an object. Other phrasal verbs like 'sit down' and 'stand up' don't take an object (e.g. "John, please stand up!"). For phrasal verbs that take an object, there are normally two possible positions where the object can go. If the object is a pronoun, there is normally only one possible position. Study the table below.

Phrasal verb	Object noun	Object pronoun (me, you, him, it, etc.)
turn on	turn on the television turn the television on	turn it on turn on it
