Which one of the men should they place under arrest and why?


## Vocabulary:

**Solve a case** – *expression* to discover the answer to a mystery. To find enough evidence to convict a person of a crime.

Suspect – *noun* somebody who seems like they may have committed the crime.

Numerical - adjective made up of, or relating to, numbers.





Nicole went to the police to **report** that someone had stolen her **vintage** ring. When the police got to her house they noticed that the window was broken, there was a total mess inside, and there were dirty footprints on the carpet. But, there were no other signs of a **break-in**. The next day, the police arrested Nicole for **fraud** and she **plead guilty**. Why?

## Vocabulary:

**Report –** *verb* to tell somebody (such as the police) that something has happened.

Vintage – adjective old and usually valuable.

Break-in - verb to illegally enter a house/property

Fraud – noun falsifying/faking documents or pretending something has happened for your own benefit.

Plead guilty - verb confess to having committed the crime.





A local plant shop **broke the law**. They had been selling an **invasive species** of **succulent plant** which is **against the law** in Vietnam. There are three men working at the store: John has a **police record**, but promises he has **mended his ways**. Steve says he hadn't been at work lately, because he cut his hands. Gary says he didn't even know what a **succulent** plant was!

Who is guilty and why?

Vocabulary:

Broke the law – verb – do something illegal.

**Invasive species** – *noun* – a plant or animal that breeds/spreads too guickly and can kill native species'.

**Succulent plant –** *noun –* a plant that requires little water, such as a cactus.

Against the law – adjective – Illegal

Police record - noun - a history of a person's crimes.

Mend your ways - expression - to become a good person
