between them? Identify the parts of the picture and any synonyms or paraphrases to describe those parts.

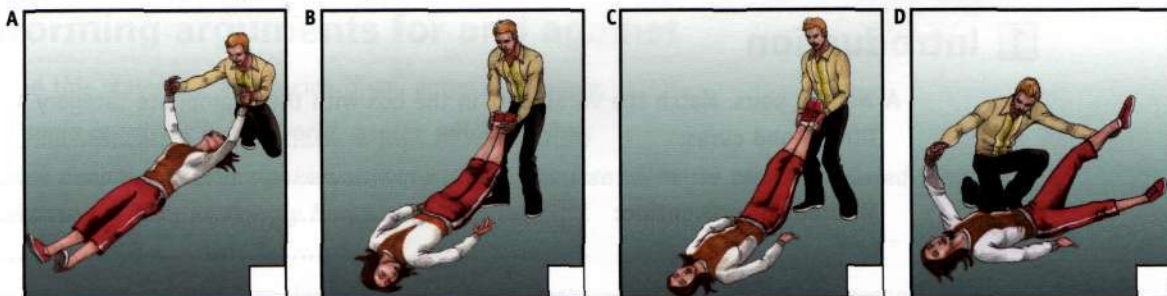

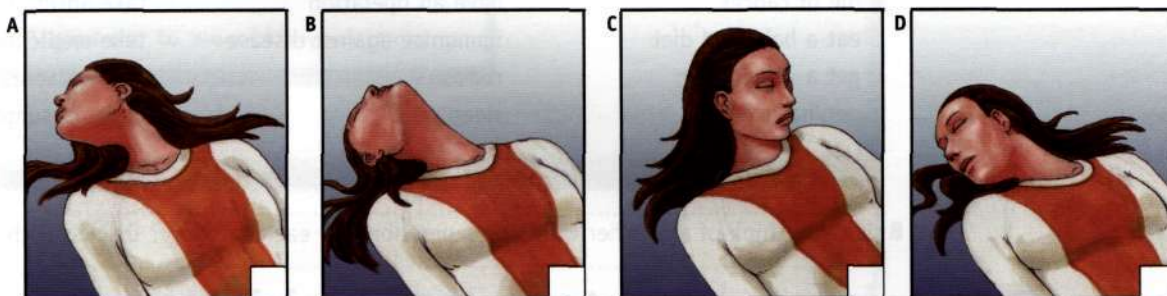
