

Set 1 Instructions (Children Match Letters)

- 1. Cut out each set of color blocks along dotted lines (each color as one strip).
- 2. Write the letters of each color on clothespins, one letter per clothespin.
- 3. Children clip the matching letter clothespin above the matching letter.
- 4. Children recite the letters, for example saying out loud, "R-E-D spells red."






Set 2 Instructions (Match Some Letters)

- 1. Cut out each set of color blocks along dotted lines (each color as one strip).
- 2. Write the letters of each color on clothespins, one letter per clothespin.
- 3. Children clip the matching letter clothespin above each box to spell the color.
- 4. Children recite the letters, for example saying out loud, "R-E-D spells red."

*In this activity, children match some of the letters and must figure out where the rest of the letters go.









Set 3 Instructions (No Matching, Spelling Independently)

- 1. Cut out each set of color blocks along dotted lines (each color as one strip).
- 2. Write the letters of each color on clothespins, one letter per clothespin.
- 3. Children clip the appropriate letter clothespin above each box to spell the color.
- 4. Children recite the letters, for example saying out loud, "R-E-D spells red."

*In this activity, children must spell the color word independently.
