



#### Train Phonics – "at" Words


#### Phase 1:

Words and Pictures on the Same Page (the picture provides a cue for the word)















#### Train Phonics – "at" Words


#### Phase 2:


Words Only on First Page, then Words and Pictures on the Same Page (student learns to read the word without the picture cue)
