Compound Adjective Catchphrase

In this teaching activity, students get their team to guess compound adjectives by explaining the word to them. Students benefit from this as they learn to be creative with their language use.

Before class, make one copy of the worksheet and cut as indicated.

Procedure

Divide the class into two teams.

One player from each team comes to the front of the class. Each player is given a compound adjective card along with the related vocabulary.

The players have to get their team to guess the compound adjective by using similar vocabulary to what's on the card.

They do this by using words and physical gestures to give clues to their team.

When the players give clues to the compound adjective, they cannot say any form of the adjective. They cannot give the first letter or give clues that rhyme. The related vocabulary also cannot be used in the description.

When a team guesses the compound adjective from the clues, they score a point.

Then, another student from the team comes up to give clues for another compound adjective.

The team with the highest number of points at the end of the game wins.
