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Connect 4

Here is a fun activity to help test students' knowledge of prepositions that come after adjectives.

Before class, make four copies of the adjective grid for each group of three and one copy of the answer key for each group.

Procedure

Split the students into groups of three.

Two students in each group will compete against each other while the third student acts as a referee.

Give each group a copy of the adjective grid and give the referee a copy of the answer key.

Explain that the students are going to take it in turns to choose a square and then add the correct preposition to the adjective in the square.

The referee checks whether the preposition is correct or not and tells the student if he/she is right or wrong.

If the student is right, he/she crosses out the adjective and writes his/her name in the square.

Play now passes to the other student and he/she chooses a square and so on.

The first student to connect four squares in a row either vertically, diagonally or horizontally is the winner.

Then give each group a new copy of the adjective grid and ask them to play again. This time, the student who was the referee plays the winner and the loser becomes the referee.

After everyone has played, give each group another copy of the grid and tell them to repeat the activity, but this time they must make a sentence using the adjective in the square with the correct preposition.
