

DILEMMAS

Objective: To encourage students to speak freely, share opinions and use the type of techniques you'd expect in lively debate e.g. interrupting

Materials: Use the sheets provided

Procedure

WARM UP: Go through the dilemmas guestions with the students. Get them to give as many examples as possible and encourage them to talk about their own experiences.

ACTIVITY 1: Ask students to give you expressions that you would use in debate.



DISAGREEING

I'm sorry, I just don't agree with you

I think you're wrong I disagree

That's rubbish! I can't believe you said that!

How can you say that?

AGREEING

I absolutely agree I'm with you on that one


You're right!

Yes, I think so too

ACTIVITY 2:

Lay the flashcards face down on the table. Each flashcard has a dilemma. Ask the students to pick one, read it, then take turns to read out the dilemma to the class. First they should give their opinion. This should lead to natural debate, as not everyone will agree on what to do or would do the same thing in that situation.





DILEMMAS

- 1. What kind of dilemmas can you think of?
- 2. How would you define a dilemma?
- 3. Have you ever been in a dilemma? How did it feel? What was the outcome?
- 4. Do you often find yourself in dilemmas (serious or otherwise)?
- 5. Who do you turn to for advice?
- 6. Are you a good listener? Do other people turn to you for advice?
- 7. Would you help a friend in trouble no matter what?



8. Is it best not to get involved in other people's problems?

9. Is it better to seek professional help to solve difficult problems or do you think that therapists, counsellors, psychologists etc. are a waste of time/money?

10. Would you consult a psychic or clairvoyant to help you with a problem?



Title - Flash cards page 1
