## **Pick up Two - Adverbs of Frequency**

In this activity, students have to put together sentences, which have been broken up into two halves.

Before class, make one copy of the sheet for each group of three or four students.

Cut up and divide the cards into two sets (one set for beginnings and one set for endings).

Ask each group to put the two sets of cards face down and spread out on the table.

Students take it in turn to pick up two cards. One from each set.

If the two halves make a grammatically correct sentence, they keep the cards and win a point.

If the two halves don't match, they have to put the cards back in the same position.

The teacher can walk around and check the correct sentences as the students are playing.

The student with the most points at the end wins.
