Party Time

In this creative activity, students practice making suggestions and requests.

Before class, make one copy of the worksheet for each student.

Procedure

Put the students into pairs and give each pair a copy of the worksheet.

In Part A, students work in pairs and plan a class party. Students make suggestions using the phrases on the worksheet and decide on the criteria for the party.

After that, put pairs together to make groups of four.

In Part B, students write the details for their party using the best ideas and suggestions from both pairs.

Each student makes requests to the other group members to organize and do things for the party. The details are written in the boxes.

Finally, when everyone has finished, each group tells the class about the party they have planned.

The class then decides which party they think would be the best.
