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Travel Advice

In this fun teaching activity, students write travel advice for visitors to a country, city or region they know well. Afterwards, they read their advice to their classmates. Their classmates guess which country, city or region they are giving advice for.

Before class, make one copy of the worksheet for each student.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the worksheet.

Ask the students to think of a country, city or region they know well.

Tell them to write the name at the top of the worksheet. The students should do this without letting anyone see what they are writing.

Students then write 12 pieces of travel advice for visitors to that country, city or region.

In the last two sentences, students have to think of new phrases for giving advice.

When everyone has finished, arrange the students into groups of three or four.

Students then take it in turns to read their travel advice to the group.

The other students in the group listen and guess which country, city or region they are giving advice for.
